2. PRE-READING DISCUSSION

FACILITATE A CLASS DISCUSSION BASED ON THE GUIDE, ENCOURAGING STUDENTS TO JUSTIFY THEIR OPINIONS AND LISTEN TO OPPOSING VIEWS.

3. GUIDED READING

AS STUDENTS READ FRANKENSTEIN, PROMPT THEM TO REVISIT THE STATEMENTS, CONSIDERING HOW THE NOVEL SUPPORTS OR CHALLENGES THEIR INITIAL BELIEFS.

4. POST-READING REFLECTION

AFTER COMPLETING THE BOOK, ASK STUDENTS TO REVISIT THE GUIDE AND REFLECT ON ANY CHANGES IN THEIR PERSPECTIVES.

5. EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

ENCOURAGE STUDENTS TO CREATE THEIR OWN STATEMENTS OR RELATE THEMES TO MODERN SCIENTIFIC DEBATES, FOSTERING

FURTHER ENGAGEMENT.

CHALLENGES AND CONSIDERATIONS

WHILE THE FRANKENSTEIN ANTICIPATION GUIDE OFFERS NUMEROUS BENEFITS, EDUCATORS SHOULD BE MINDFUL OF POTENTIAL CHALLENGES:

- TIME CONSTRAINTS: INCORPORATING ANTICIPATION GUIDES REQUIRES DEDICATED CLASSROOM TIME FOR DISCUSSION AND REFLECTION, WHICH MUST BE BALANCED WITHIN CURRICULUM SCHEDULES.

- ASSESS GROWTH: USE STUDENTS' POST-READING RESPONSES TO EVALUATE THEIR UNDERSTANDING AND EVOLVING VIEWPOINTS.
