Second was the belated but wholehearted acceptance of the Heider theory of balance and its subsequent wane. Its wane had nothing to do with its inherent merits. It waned because it could not survive on the Procrustean bed of the psychologists' theory of choice. It did not occur to the psychologists to question their assumptions about how people made the choices that lead to purposeful communication (Ackoff and Emery, 1972, p. 58). The last example has been the bitter and unended furore about McLuhan. This time the psychologists and sociologists have been strangely quiet but we can be sure this does not imply acquiescence in McLuhan's views.

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
