EXAMPLE:

"DEAR EAGLE SCOUT BOARD OF REVIEW COMMITTEE,"

"IT IS WITH GREAT PRIDE AND ENTHUSIASM THAT I WRITE THIS RECOMMENDATION FOR MY SON/DAUGHTER, [SCOUT'S NAME], AS THEY PURSUE THE RANK OF EAGLE SCOUT.""

BODY OF THE LETTER

DIVIDE THE MAIN CONTENT INTO SEVERAL KEY SECTIONS THAT HIGHLIGHT THE SCOUT'S QUALITIES, ACHIEVEMENTS, AND CHARACTER TRAITS.

1. PERSONAL QUALITIES AND CHARACTER

DISCUSS THE SCOUT'S INTEGRITY, RESPONSIBILITY, PERSEVERANCE, AND RESPECT. SHARE SPECIFIC INSTANCES THAT DEMONSTRATE THESE TRAITS.

SAMPLE POINTS:

- HOW THE FAMILY ENCOURAGES COMMUNITY SERVICE AND LEADERSHIP.
- THE IMPORTANCE OF SCOUTING IN YOUR FAMILY'S LIFE.
- YOUR PRIDE IN THE SCOUT'S ACCOMPLISHMENTS.

CONCLUSION

SUMMARIZE YOUR STRONG ENDORSEMENT OF THE SCOUT'S READINESS FOR THE EAGLE RANK. END WITH A POSITIVE CLOSING STATEMENT AND YOUR CONTACT INFORMATION FOR FOLLOW-UP IF NECESSARY.

EXAMPLE:

__ "IN CONCLUSION, I WHOLEHEARTEDLY SUPPORT [SCOUT'S NAME] IN THEIR PURSUIT OF THE EAGLE SCOUT RANK. THEIR DEDICATION, INTEGRITY, AND LEADERSHIP MAKE THEM AN EXCELLENT REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SCOUT OATH AND LAW. PLEASE FEEL FREE TO CONTACT ME IF YOU REQUIRE ANY FURTHER INFORMATION." __

KEY ELEMENTS TO INCLUDE IN YOUR RECOMMENDATION LETTER

- PERSONAL ANECDOTES: SPECIFIC STORIES THAT ILLUSTRATE THE SCOUT'S CHARACTER AND LEADERSHIP.

- HONEST ASSESSMENT: AUTHENTIC PRAISE SUPPORTED BY EXAMPLES RATHER THAN GENERIC STATEMENTS.
- FOCUS ON THE SCOUT'S GROWTH: EMPHASIZE HOW THE SCOUT HAS MATURED THROUGH THEIR EXPERIENCES.

3. USE SPECIFIC EXAMPLES

VAGUE STATEMENTS LIKE "HE IS A GREAT LEADER" ARE LESS IMPACTFUL THAN DETAILED STORIES ABOUT A SPECIFIC PROJECT OR CHALLENGE.

4. PROOFREAD AND EDIT

ENSURE THE LETTER IS FREE OF GRAMMATICAL ERRORS AND TYPOS. A POLISHED LETTER REFLECTS YOUR RESPECT FOR THE PROCESS.

5. PERSONALIZE THE LETTER

AVOID GENERIC TEMPLATES. TAILOR YOUR LETTER TO REFLECT YOUR UNIQUE OBSERVATIONS OF THE SCOUT.

IN MANY CASES, A COMPELLING PARENT LETTER CAN TIP THE BALANCE IN FAVOR OF APPROVAL, ESPECIALLY WHEN OTHER PARTS OF THE APPLICATION ARE BORDERLINE.

STRUCTURING AN EFFECTIVE PARENT RECOMMENDATION LETTER

A WELL-CRAFTED PARENT RECOMMENDATION SHOULD BE CLEAR, SINCERE, AND COMPREHENSIVE. BELOW ARE ESSENTIAL COMPONENTS AND BEST PRACTICES FOR STRUCTURING SUCH A LETTER.

INTRODUCTION

BEGIN WITH A WARM, PROFESSIONAL OPENING THAT STATES YOUR RELATIONSHIP WITH THE SCOUT AND THE PURPOSE OF THE

LETTER.

EXAMPLE:

"I AM PLEASED TO WRITE THIS LETTER IN SUPPORT OF MY SON/DAUGHTER, [SCOUT'S NAME], AS THEY PURSUE THE RANK OF EAGLE SCOUT. AS A PARENT WHO HAS CLOSELY OBSERVED THEIR JOURNEY THROUGH THE BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA, I AM PROUD TO SHARE INSIGHTS INTO THEIR CHARACTER, LEADERSHIP, AND DEDICATION."

BACKGROUND AND PERSONAL QUALITIES

DESCRIBE THE SCOUT'S PERSONALITY TRAITS, VALUES, AND CHARACTER. USE SPECIFIC EXAMPLES TO ILLUSTRATE THESE QUALITIES.

KEY QUALITIES TO HIGHLIGHT INCLUDE:

- RESPONSIBILITY AND ACCOUNTABILITY
- PERSEVERANCE AND RESILIENCE
- LEADERSHIP SKILLS AND TEAMWORK
- COMPASSION AND SERVICE ORIENTATION
- INTEGRITY AND HONESTY

"FACING THE CHALLENGES OF PLANNING AND EXECUTING A WEEK-LONG CAMPING TRIP, [SCOUT'S NAME] DEVELOPED PROBLEM-SOLVING SKILLS AND RESILIENCE. THEY LEARNED TO ADAPT TO UNFORESEEN CIRCUMSTANCES AND REMAINED COMMITTED TO ENSURING THE SUCCESS OF THE EVENT."

CONCLUSION AND ENDORSEMENT

SUMMARIZE YOUR SUPPORT AND CONFIDENCE IN THE SCOUT'S READINESS FOR EAGLE. EXPRESS YOUR BELIEF THAT THEY EMBODY THE IDEALS OF THE SCOUT OATH AND LAW.

EXAMPLE:

"IN MY VIEW, [SCOUT'S NAME] EXEMPLIFIES THE CHARACTER, LEADERSHIP, AND SERVICE THAT THE EAGLE SCOUT RANK RECOGNIZES. I WHOLEHEARTEDLY ENDORSE THEIR APPLICATION AND AM CONFIDENT THEY WILL CONTINUE TO MAKE MEANINGFUL CONTRIBUTIONS TO THEIR COMMUNITY."

BEST PRACTICES AND TIPS FOR WRITING A PARENT RECOMMENDATION LETTER

- BE HONEST AND AUTHENTIC: GENUINE STORIES RESONATE MORE THAN GENERIC PRAISE.
- USE SPECIFIC EXAMPLES: VAGUE STATEMENTS ARE LESS IMPACTFUL; DETAILED ANECDOTES ARE COMPELLING.
- KEEP IT CONCISE: AIM FOR 1-2 PAGES, FOCUSING ON QUALITY OVER QUANTITY.
- HIGHLIGHT UNIQUE QUALITIES: EMPHASIZE WHAT MAKES YOUR SCOUT STAND OUT.
- PROOFREAD CAREFULLY: ENSURE CLARITY, PROPER GRAMMAR, AND PROFESSIONALISM.
- INCLUDE CONTACT INFORMATION: OPTIONAL, BUT CAN BE HELPFUL FOR REVIEWERS SEEKING FURTHER INSIGHTS.

COMMON MISTAKES TO AVOID

- OVERLY GENERIC PRAISE: AVOID CLICHÉ'S OR VAGUE COMPLIMENTS.
- EXAGGERATION: BE TRUTHFUL; INTEGRITY IS KEY.

- NEGLECTING TO PERSONALIZE: TAILOR THE LETTER TO THE INDIVIDUAL SCOUT RATHER THAN USING A TEMPLATE WITHOUT CUSTOMIZATION.
- FOCUSING SOLELY ON ACHIEVEMENTS: HIGHLIGHT CHARACTER AND LEADERSHIP QUALITIES, NOT JUST ACCOMPLISHMENTS.
