Subjects consisted of both occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants, who have served as a fieldwork educator within the past ten years at a fieldwork site currently affiliated with Saginaw Valley State University's Master of Science in Occupational Therapy program. **METHODS.** Information was obtained through an online, researcher-designed survey, which contained ten open and closed-ended questions. **RESULTS.** Many of the preparatory practices engaged in by occupational therapy

fieldwork educators were perceived as beneficial. A majority of the survey respondents who participated in MOTEC fieldwork educator workshops(s), certification courses, and who shared the responsibility of educating a student with another occupational therapist, found these preparation practices to be helpful. One of the most common preparatory practices engaged in involved reviewing coursework completed during primary occupational therapy education; results indicate that only 4% of participants to partake in preparatory practices if they were offered personal incentives and increased access to preparation resources. **CONCLUSION.** Occupational therapy fieldwork educators who participated in preparatory practices were found to be valuable, additional motivational factors would increase occupational therapy fieldwork educators' participation in preparatory practices. -- From page 2.

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
