DEFINING HEALTH DISPARITIES

HEALTH DISPARITIES REFER TO PREVENTABLE DIFFERENCES IN HEALTH OUTCOMES EXPERIENCED BY SOCIALLY DISADVANTAGED POPULATIONS. PROMOTING HEALTH EQUITY

4. FOCUS ON SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH

ADDRESSING FACTORS SUCH AS HOUSING, EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT, AND FOOD SECURITY IS CRUCIAL. NURSES CAN CONNECT PATIENTS TO RESOURCES AND ADVOCATE FOR POLICIES THAT IMPROVE THESE SOCIAL DETERMINANTS.

5. POLICY ADVOCACY AND SYSTEM CHANGE

CASE STUDY 1: REDUCING CHILDHOOD ASTHMA DISPARITIES IN URBAN COMMUNITIES

A TEAM OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSES COLLABORATED WITH SCHOOLS AND COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS TO IMPLEMENT HOME ASSESSMENTS, IMPROVE INDOOR AIR QUALITY, AND PROVIDE EDUCATION ON ASTHMA MANAGEMENT. THE INTERVENTION LED TO A SIGNIFICANT REDUCTION IN HOSPITALIZATIONS AND SCHOOL ABSENTEEISM AMONG CHILDREN IN LOW-INCOME NEIGHBORHOODS.

CASE STUDY 2: ADDRESSING DIABETES IN RURAL POPULATIONS

NURSES WORKING IN RURAL CLINICS UTILIZED TELEHEALTH PLATFORMS TO DELIVER CULTURALLY APPROPRIATE DIABETES EDUCATION, COORDINATED MEDICATION MANAGEMENT, AND CONNECTED PATIENTS WITH SOCIAL SERVICES. THE APPROACH IMPROVED GLYCEMIC CONTROL AND REDUCED EMERGENCY VISITS.
