Foxe's title for the second edition (vol I) is quite different from the first edition where he claimed his material as these latter days of peril...touching on matters of the Church'. In 1570, Foxe's book is an Ecclesiastical History containing the acts and monuments [no capitals] of thynges passed in every kynges tyme in this realm [England], specially in the Church of England. It describes persecutions, horrible troubles, the suffering of martyrs [new], and other such thinges incident ... in England and Scotland, and [new] all other foreign nations.
