For the 45 normal subjects that failed the HRR test at least once, only figures on plate 7 (3rd screening plate) were missed. All 45 subjects, however, passed the test when coaxed and given 2 extra seconds to view missed plates. None of the color vision defectives passed the test on the 3rd administration. The Farnsworth D-15 and the Farnsworth Lantern each had excellent test-retest reliability. Consistent testing results were found with each. Additionally, the HRR test was found to predict the Farnsworth Lantern failures (high positive predictive value) but had mixed results in predicting results with the Farnsworth D- 15. In summary, the screening plates of the 4th Edition of the HRR Pseudoisochromatic Plate Test do an excellent job of discriminating red-green color vision defectives from color vision normals; however, in order to eliminate false positives, extra time must be given to view plate number 7.
