Mit konkreten Informationen über das System Klinik mit seinen formalen Anforderungen, über die Arbeit in Einzel- und Gruppensitzungen sowie mit Angehörigen bereitet das Buch auf den Klinikalltag vor und überträgt so theoretisches Wissen in die Praxis. Beispiele und Übungen unterstützen, eine eigene Haltung auszudifferenzieren.

Solche Ängste gehen über bloßes Lampenfieber hinaus und können so stark ausgeprägt sein, dass im schlimmsten Fall eine Musikkarriere abgebrochen werden muss oder gar nicht erst angestrebt wird. Auch in schwächeren Ausprägungen verursachen Auftrittsängste deutliches Leid. Dieses Buch liefert einen kognitiv-verhaltenstherapeutischen Leitfaden zur Behandlung von Auftrittsängsten bei Musikerinnen und Musikern. Der Band fasst zunächst den aktuellen Kenntnisstand zu Erscheinungsformen, Erklärungs- und Behandlungsansätzen von Auftrittsängsten zusammen. Anschließend werden die

einzelnen Schritte der Behandlung von Auftrittssängsten detailliert beschrieben. Um den unterschiedlichen Erscheinungsformen von Auftrittssängsten gerecht zu werden, wird hierfür ein modulatorientiertes Vorgehen gewählt, das es erlaubt, den Behandlungsablauf bestmöglich zu individualisieren. Anwendungsorientiert wird auf Diagnostik, Psychoedukation, Konfrontationsverfahren, Verhaltensexperimente, kognitive Verfahren, Entspannungstechniken und Rückfallprophylaxe eingegangen. Zudem werden auch konkrete Schritte zur Auftrittsplanung und Kurzinterventionen für besonders schwierige Situationen dargestellt. Zahlreiche Beispiele, Therapiedialoge und Arbeitsblätter veranschaulichen das Vorgehen und erleichtern die Umsetzung der einzelnen Therapieschritte in der klinischen Praxis.

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Störungen gleichermaßen abzielt. Angestrebt werden der Aufbau und die Verbesserung von Fertigkeiten zur Emotionsregulation sowie gleichzeitig die Substanzreduktion bzw. das Erreichen und Aufrechterhalten von Abstinenz. Der Praxisleitfaden stellt DBT-S-spezifische Behandlungsstrategien dar, erläutert den Aufbau eines DBT-S-Skills-Programmes und veranschaulicht die konkrete Anwendung der DBT-S in verschiedenen Behandlungssettings. Das Buch informiert zunächst über die beiden Störungsbilder, die Auswirkungen der Komorbidität und deren Entstehung. Weiterhin wird auf die Entwicklung der DBT-S eingegangen und es werden Ergebnisse von Wirksamkeitsstudien referiert. Basierend auf der Standard-DBT werden spezifische Erweiterungen der DBT-S und ihre Behandlungsstrategien vorgestellt. Dazu gehören u. a. spezielle Attachmentstrategien, um Patientinnen und Patienten zu unterstützen, eine Bindung an die Therapie aufzubauen und Therapieabbrüchen vorzubeugen. Die Arbeit im Konsultationsteam, das Konzept der dialektischen Abstinenz sowie Strategien im Umgang mit fortbestehendem oder rückfälligem Konsumverhalten werden erläutert. Für die Vermittlung von Fertigkeiten im Umgang mit Suchtverhalten, den Folgen jahrelangen Konsums und dem Aufbau sowie der Verstärkung der Abstinenz werden zahlreiche Informations- und Arbeitsblätter zur Verfügung gestellt. Die Möglichkeiten der Umsetzung der DBT-S im stationären, teilstationären und ambulanten Bereich sowie in der sozialen Arbeit werden anhand konkreter Abläufe und Beispiele skizziert. Zudem wird aufgezeigt, wie mit herausfordernden Therapiesituationen umgegangen werden kann.
