4. SUPPORT THE DEVELOPMENT OF ENGLISH LANGUAGE SKILLS

WHILE CONTENT MASTERY IS VITAL, EXPLICIT SUPPORT FOR DEVELOPING LISTENING, SPEAKING, READING, AND WRITING SKILLS IN ENGLISH IS EQUALLY IMPORTANT FOR ELs' ACADEMIC SUCCESS.

FOCUS AREAS

- LISTENING: USE RICH, COMPREHENSIBLE INPUT AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS TO PRACTICE ACTIVE LISTENING.
- SPEAKING: PROMOTE ORAL LANGUAGE THROUGH DISCUSSIONS, PRESENTATIONS, AND PEER INTERACTIONS.
- READING: PROVIDE LEVELED TEXTS AND STRATEGIES FOR DECODING, FLUENCY, AND COMPREHENSION.
- WRITING: OFFER STRUCTURED WRITING OPPORTUNITIES WITH SCAFFOLDS AND FEEDBACK.

STRATEGIES TO FOSTER LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT

- USE LANGUAGE MODELING AND THINK-ALOUD STRATEGIES.

- DIAGNOSTIC ASSESSMENT: PRE-ASSESSMENTS TO IDENTIFY STUDENTS' PRIOR KNOWLEDGE AND LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY.

BEST PRACTICES

- USE ASSESSMENT DATA TO DIFFERENTIATE INSTRUCTION.
- PROVIDE TIMELY, CONSTRUCTIVE FEEDBACK.

- ESTABLISH CLEAR EXPECTATIONS: CREATE ROUTINES THAT PROMOTE RESPECT AND COOPERATION.
- DISPLAY CULTURAL ARTIFACTS: USE VISUALS, POSTERS, AND MATERIALS THAT REFLECT DIVERSITY.
- PROMOTE POSITIVE INTERACTIONS: ENCOURAGE PEER SUPPORT AND COLLABORATIVE LEARNING.
