ALSIANS ARE AN INTRIGUING AND DIVERSE GROUP OF PEOPLE WHOSE CULTURAL, HISTORICAL, AND GEOGRAPHICAL ATTRIBUTES CONTRIBUTE SIGNIFICANTLY TO THE RICH TAPESTRY OF HUMAN CIVILIZATION. THOUGH THE TERM "ALSIANS" MAY NOT BE AS WIDELY RECOGNIZED IN MAINSTREAM DISCOURSE, IT ENCOMPASSES A BROAD SPECTRUM OF COMMUNITIES WHOSE TRADITIONS, LANGUAGES, AND HISTORIES OFFER VALUABLE INSIGHTS INTO THE HUMAN EXPERIENCE. THIS ARTICLE AIMS TO PROVIDE A COMPREHENSIVE OVERVIEW OF ALSIANS, EXPLORING THEIR ORIGINS, CULTURAL PRACTICES, SOCIAL STRUCTURES, AND CONTEMPORARY SIGNIFICANCE.

alsatians: *Alsace to the Alsatians?* Christopher J. Fischer, 2014-04-01 The region of Alsace, located between the hereditary enemies of France and Germany, served as a trophy of war four times between 1870–1945. With each shift, French and German officials sought to win the allegiance of the local populace. In response to these pressures, Alsatians invoked regionalism—articulated as a political language, a cultural vision, and a community of identity—not only to define and defend their own interests against the nationalist claims of France and Germany, but also to push for social change, defend religious rights, and promote the status of the region within the larger national community. Alsatian regionalism however, was neither unitary nor unifying, as Alsatians themselves were divided politically, socially, and culturally. The author shows that the Janus-faced character of Alsatian regionalism points to the ambiguous role of regional identity in both fostering and inhibiting loyalty to the nation. Finally, the author uses the case of Alsace to explore the traditional designations of French civic nationalism versus German ethnic nationalism and argues for the strong similarities between the two countries' conceptions of nationhood.

alsatians: *Alsatian Acts of Identity* Liliane Mangold Vassberg, 1993 A German dialect spoken in Alsace (France), has rapidly lost way to French since 1945. This book investigates language choice, language attitudes and ethnic identity in Alsace today. The Alsatian case study points out the complex interrelationship of linguistic and identity change with historical, social and psychological processes.

alsatians: *The Alsatian Bieber (Beaver) Clan: German - American Educational and Mainline Protestant Leaders of Pennsylvania, North Carolina, the Midwest, and Beyond* Christopher Hunt Robertson, M.Ed., 2021-11-06 Serving in 35 states and Canada, the German-American Alsatian Bieber (Beaver) clan helped to create and lead more than 40 Lutheran churches, two seminaries, and multiple universities - many of which continue to serve their communities, generation after generation. Past publications have mentioned individual Bieber (Beaver) ministers and educators, but this is the first effort to compile their stories collectively, from the 1700's to the present. This work recognizes such leaders' roles in building and sustaining churches and schools, the community centers of early America. This work received a 2022 Award of Excellence from the North Carolina Society of Historians. The Society's Judging Panel stated: "Mr. Robertson appears to have left 'no stone unturned' in documenting the Bieber family history from 1744 to the present. The account covers the years when the family first settled as immigrants in Pennsylvania, making significant contributions there before moving south to settle in North Carolina. A wealth of information provided from newspapers and other sources chronicles the impact the Bieber family had in Western North Carolina, where family members contributed greatly to the state's history, especially in religion and education ... This family history is well written, well organized, and well illustrated with many photographs of excellent quality, drawings, and even maps ... The author has searched and researched many, many sources ... Brief biographical sketches illuminate the lives of men and women of Bieber heritage who made major contributions to their

communities, state, and nation, and whose ideas and recommendations are, in many ways, relevant in today's world." This work is archived by universities and seminaries of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America. It has also been recommended by the Concordia Historical Institute of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod.

A chapter on Sartre and religion talks about his thought in relation to Christianity, Judaism and Buddhism, while one on Sartre and children discusses his work in relation to the issues of freedom, pregnancy and autism. Beyond this, there are an additional seven chapters covering a wide variety of topics by leading scholars in the fields of philosophy, literature psychology, history and political thought. While prior publications on Sartre have generally divided his work into two periods, pre-and post-Marxist, this volume deliberately stresses a middle and final period as well. As representative of the middle period, there is an emphasis on *Notebooks for an Ethics*, while Sartre's last work, *Hope Now*, is also treated as being philosophically significant in its own right. This approach helps to cast a new light on what Sartre has to say about authenticity, childhood and consciousness as embodied, among other subjects. The volume also addresses many and diverse issues of current interest, including those of freedom, Marxism and Sartre's relation to ethics. There are sections of the book that deal with history and the historical situations that helped to shape Sartre's thought, as well as articles that deal with Sartre as a specifically French thinker. A chapter deals with Sartre's relation to women , and here the issues of maternity as problematic, plus authentic, adult relationships are discussed. Finally, in addition to authors in philosophy and literature, there are articles by a child psychiatrist and a clinical psychologist to help to provide new insights on Sartre's work. Even as an academic philosopher Sartre always remained an iconoclast and the aim of this book is, at least partially to capture and provide the reader with insight into this spirit.
