And then there were *Zooropa* and *Pop* - dance-oriented albums that showed the initially punk-oriented quartet exploring effects, sounds and territories that few of their contemporaries dared contemplate. That they should exist forty years after their debut is testament to the will, fortitude and versatility U2 hold. Their most recent works *Songs of Innocence* and *Songs of Experience* have proven their most reflective and perhaps their most autobiographical. What lies next for U2 only the band know, but

this book delves into their past work, without leaving a passenger behind. The author Eoghan Lyng is a music writer and pop fanatic. Having spent a life listening to idiosyncratic pop, Lyng honed this fascination into something more tangible. His writing credits include New Sounds, We Are Cult, Culture Sonar, The Phacemag, DMovies, The Irish Post and The Digital Fix.
