THE CHANGE IN TITLE WAS MADE BY THE AMERICAN PUBLISHER, SCHOLASTIC, TO BETTER APPEAL TO THE AMERICAN MARKET.

THE ORIGINAL TITLE AND ITS SIGNIFICANCE

THE ORIGINAL TITLE, “HARRY POTTER AND THE PHILOSOPHER’S STONE,” IS A REFERENCE TO THE ANCIENT LEGEND OF THE PHILOSOPHER’S STONE, A MYTHICAL SUBSTANCE CAPABLE OF TURNING BASE METALS INTO GOLD AND GRANTING IMMORTALITY THROUGH THE ELIXIR OF LIFE. ACCEPTANCE AND PUBLICATION

THE BREAKTHROUGH CAME WHEN ROWLING SUBMITTED HER MANUSCRIPT TO BLOOMSBURY PUBLISHING, A RELATIVELY SMALL BRITISH PUBLISHER. THE PUBLISHER'S EDITOR, BARRY CUNNINGHAM, WAS CAPTIVATED BY THE STORY AND DECIDED TO PUBLISH IT. THE FIRST PRINT RUN WAS MODEST, WITH ONLY 500 COPIES INITIALLY PRINTED.

RECEPTION AND IMPACT OF THE FIRST BOOK

INITIAL RECEPTION
