THE SCREENPLAY WAS DESIGNED TO HIGHLIGHT THE AWKWARDNESS AND HUMOR INHERENT IN SOCIAL RITUALS LIKE WEDDINGS AND FUNERALS, WHICH SERVE AS PIVOTAL MOMENTS FOR CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT AND PLOT PROGRESSION.

THE FILM'S PRODUCTION WAS NOTABLE FOR ITS MODEST BUDGET OF APPROXIMATELY \$4.4 MILLION BUT WENT ON TO GROSS OVER \$245 MILLION WORLDWIDE, MARKING IT AS ONE OF THE MOST SUCCESSFUL BRITISH FILMS EVER AT THE TIME.
