- AGE RANGE: WHILE SUITABLE FOR A BROAD AGE RANGE, VERY YOUNG CHILDREN MIGHT REQUIRE ADULT GUIDANCE TO FULLY GRASP THE THEMES.

DESPITE THESE MINOR CRITICISMS, THE OVERALL RECEPTION REMAINS OVERWHELMINGLY POSITIVE, THANKS TO ITS CHARMING ILLUSTRATIONS AND HEARTFELT MESSAGE.
