I found that this model is very ambiguous and contestable, because it rests upon cultural generalization and the simplification of highly complex webs of human interaction. The model was nonetheless useful to me as it provided me with a means of looking at cultural differences, which were after all the basis of my division between 'the West and the rest' in this assignment. Moreover, it became clear to me that if one wants to discuss cultural differences at global scale, one cannot avoid generalizations. Within the subsequent discussion of cultural identity and the roots of such a strong dichotomy between 'the West and the rest', I tried - at quite some length - to highlight how 'the West' as a civilization is perceived not only by Westerners themselves, but also by non-Western civilizations,

and which aspects represent the crucial characteristics that separate them. My conclusion is that the main differences between Western and non-Western civilization are found in a number of aspects that are peculiar characteristics of modernity, including secularization, individualism, and democratic values. Having said that, modernity is not a distinctly Western concept. Today, many non-Western societies are i.

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
