FALKLANDS WAR ROYAL MARINES

THE FALKLANDS WAR, FOUGHT BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND ARGENTINA IN 1982, WAS A PIVOTAL CONFLICT THAT SHOWCASED THE BRAVERY, RESILIENCE, AND STRATEGIC PROWESS OF THE BRITISH ARMED FORCES. AMONG THE KEY UNITS THAT PLAYED A CRUCIAL ROLE IN THIS CONFLICT WERE THE ROYAL MARINES. - ROYAL MARINES COMMANDO: THE MAIN OPERATIONAL FORCE, TRAINED FOR HIGH-INTENSITY COMBAT.
- SUPPORT AND LOGISTICS UNITS: ENSURING OPERATIONAL SUSTAINMENT.

THEIR CAPABILITIES INCLUDE:

- AMPHIBIOUS ASSAULT AND RECONNAISSANCE
- MOUNTAIN AND JUNGLE WARFARE
- COUNTER-TERRORISM AND SPECIAL OPERATIONS
- HUMANITARIAN AID AND DISASTER RELIEF

THE ROLE OF ROYAL MARINES IN THE FALKLANDS WAR

STRATEGIC IMPORTANCE

DURING THE FALKLANDS WAR, THE ROYAL MARINES WERE INTEGRAL TO THE BRITISH MILITARY STRATEGY. THEIR PRIMARY ROLES INCLUDED:

- CONDUCTING AMPHIBIOUS LANDINGS
- SECURING KEY LOCATIONS
- ENGAGING IN COMBAT WITH ARGENTINE FORCES
- PROVIDING RECONNAISSANCE AND INTELLIGENCE

DEPLOYMENT AND INITIAL CHALLENGES

THE ROYAL MARINES WERE AMONG THE FIRST BRITISH FORCES TO ARRIVE IN THE FALKLANDS. THEIR DEPLOYMENT INVOLVED:

- THE 40 COMMANDO UNIT, WHICH PLAYED A CENTRAL ROLE IN THE LANDINGS

- THE 45 COMMANDO, INVOLVED IN SUBSEQUENT OPERATIONS AND SECURING TERRITORY
- THE USE OF SPECIALIZED LANDING CRAFT AND HELICOPTERS FOR AMPHIBIOUS ASSAULT

INITIAL CHALLENGES FACED BY THE MARINES INCLUDED ROUGH TERRAIN, UNPREDICTABLE WEATHER, AND CONFRONTING WELL-ARMED ARGENTINE FORCES PREPARED FOR DEFENSE. DESPITE THESE OBSTACLES, THE MARINES DEMONSTRATED EXCEPTIONAL ADAPTABILITY AND COMBAT EFFECTIVENESS.

MAJOR OPERATIONS INVOLVING ROYAL MARINES

THE FALKLANDS LANDINGS (OPERATION CORPORATE)

OPERATION CORPORATE WAS THE BRITISH PLAN TO SEIZE THE FALKLAND ISLANDS. THE ROYAL MARINES' INVOLVEMENT WAS PIVOTAL IN THE FOLLOWING WAYS:

- LANDING AT SAN CARLOS WATER: THE 3RD BATTALION ROYAL MARINES (3 RM) LED THE AMPHIBIOUS ASSAULT, ESTABLISHING A FOOTHOLD.
- SECURING THE BEACHES: MARINES QUICKLY MOVED TO SECURE LANDING SITES AND ESTABLISH DEFENSIVE POSITIONS.
- ENGAGEMENT WITH ARGENTINE FORCES: MARINES ENGAGED IN FIREFIGHTS WITH ENTRENCHED ARGENTINE TROOPS, OFTEN IN CHALLENGING TERRAIN.

BATTLE OF GOOSE GREEN

ONE OF THE MOST NOTABLE ENGAGEMENTS INVOLVING THE ROYAL MARINES WAS THE BATTLE OF GOOSE GREEN:

- BACKGROUND: ARGENTINE FORCES OCCUPIED GOOSE GREEN, A STRATEGIC SETTLEMENT.
- ROYAL MARINES' ROLE: 2 PARA (PARACHUTE REGIMENT) AND SUPPORTING ROYAL MARINES UNITS LAUNCHED A COMBINED ATTACK.
- OUTCOME: THE BATTLE ENDED WITH A BRITISH VICTORY, WITH ROYAL MARINES PLAYING A CRUCIAL ROLE IN ASSAULTING ENTRENCHED POSITIONS AND OVERCOMING ARGENTINE DEFENSES.

THE BATTLE OF MOUNT LONGDON

ANOTHER SIGNIFICANT ENGAGEMENT WAS AT MOUNT LONGDON:

- STRATEGIC IMPORTANCE: MOUNTAIN OVERLOOKING STANLEY, THE CAPITAL.
- ROYAL MARINES' CONTRIBUTION: MARINES FROM 42 COMMANDO PARTICIPATED IN INTENSE COMBAT TO CAPTURE THE HEIGHTS.
- IMPACT: SECURED THE FLANK OF BRITISH FORCES AND CONTRIBUTED TO THE EVENTUAL FALL OF STANLEY.

THE CAPTURE OF WIRELESS HILL

ROYAL MARINES ALSO PARTICIPATED IN CAPTURING WIRELESS HILL, DISRUPTING ARGENTINE COMMUNICATIONS AND GAINING A TACTICAL ADVANTAGE.

CHALLENGES FACED BY ROYAL MARINES DURING THE FALKLANDS WAR

WHILE THE ROYAL MARINES DEMONSTRATED REMARKABLE RESILIENCE, THEY FACED SEVERAL CHALLENGES:

- HARSH WEATHER CONDITIONS: COLD, RAIN, AND STRONG WINDS AFFECTED OPERATIONS.
- LIMITED SUPPLIES AND LOGISTICS: THE REMOTE LOCATION COMPLICATED RESUPPLY EFFORTS.
- ARGENTINE DEFENSES: WELL-FORTIFIED POSITIONS AND DEFENSIVE FIREPOWER MADE ASSAULTS COSTLY.
- TERRAIN DIFFICULTIES: ROCKY, UNEVEN TERRAIN HINDERED MOVEMENT AND MANEUVERING.
- PROLONGED ENGAGEMENTS: EXTENDED COMBAT PERIODS TESTED ENDURANCE AND MORALE.

DESPITE THESE HARDSHIPS, THE ROYAL MARINES' TRAINING, DETERMINATION, AND TACTICAL FLEXIBILITY ENABLED THEM TO

SUCCEED.

LEGACY AND RECOGNITION

HONORS AND AWARDS

ROYAL MARINES RECEIVED NUMEROUS COMMENDATIONS FOR THEIR BRAVERY, INCLUDING:

- VICTORIA CROSSES: RECOGNIZED FOR EXCEPTIONAL VALOR.
- MILITARY MEDALS AND COMMENDATIONS: AWARDED FOR BRAVERY, LEADERSHIP, AND SERVICE.

IMPACT ON ROYAL MARINES' REPUTATION

THE FALKLANDS WAR CEMENTED THE ROYAL MARINES' REPUTATION AS AN ELITE FIGHTING FORCE CAPABLE OF CONDUCTING COMPLEX AMPHIBIOUS OPERATIONS UNDER CHALLENGING CONDITIONS.

ORGANIZATION AND DEPLOYMENT

UNITS INVOLVED

DURING THE FALKLANDS CONFLICT, SEVERAL ROYAL MARINES UNITS WERE DEPLOYED, MOST NOTABLY:

- 40 COMMANDO
- 42 COMMANDO
- 45 COMMANDO
- 45 (ROYAL MARINE) COMMANDO

AMONG THESE, 40 COMMANDO PLAYED A PARTICULARLY PROMINENT ROLE DUE TO ITS LEADERSHIP IN KEY LANDINGS AND COMBAT OPERATIONS.

PREPARATION AND DEPLOYMENT

THE ROYAL MARINES HAD BEEN UNDERGOING MODERNIZATION AND TRAINING EXERCISES PRIOR TO THE CONFLICT, WHICH PROVED INVALUABLE. ONCE THE CRISIS ERUPTED, THE MARINES SWIFTLY MOBILIZED, WITH UNITS TRANSPORTED ABOARD NUMEROUS ROYAL NAVY VESSELS. THEIR DEPLOYMENT INVOLVED COMPLEX AMPHIBIOUS OPERATIONS, REQUIRING METICULOUS PLANNING, COORDINATION WITH NAVAL FORCES, AND ADAPTABILITY TO EVOLVING BATTLEFIELD CONDITIONS.

KEY OPERATIONS AND BATTLES

LANDING AT SAN CARLOS WATER

ONE OF THE MOST ICONIC MOMENTS OF THE ROYAL MARINES' INVOLVEMENT WAS THE AMPHIBIOUS ASSAULT AT SAN CARLOS WATER, OFTEN DUBBED "BOMB ALLEY." THE MARINES HAD TO CONTEND WITH INTENSE ARGENTINE AIR ATTACKS, INCLUDING DIVE BOMBERS AND MISSILE STRIKES, WHILE ESTABLISHING A FOOTHOLD ON HOSTILE SHORES.

FEATURES OF THE OPERATION:

- INSERTION OF MARINES VIA LANDING CRAFT UNDER HEAVY AIR COVER
- ESTABLISHMENT OF DEFENSIVE POSITIONS AMIDST ONGOING AERIAL ASSAULTS
- SECURING THE BEACHHEAD TO ENABLE SUBSEQUENT LANDINGS AND RESUPPLY

PROS:

- DEMONSTRATED AMPHIBIOUS ASSAULT CAPABILITY UNDER ADVERSE CONDITIONS
- SHOWCASED RESILIENCE AGAINST ENEMY AIR ATTACKS

CONS:

- HEAVY CASUALTIES DUE TO ENEMY AIR SUPERIORITY
- INITIAL DIFFICULTIES IN ESTABLISHING SECURE SUPPLY LINES

RECONNAISSANCE AND INTELLIGENCE GATHERING

ROYAL MARINES, PARTICULARLY RECONNAISSANCE UNITS, PLAYED A VITAL ROLE IN GATHERING INTELLIGENCE ON ARGENTINE POSITIONS AND MOVEMENTS. THEIR STEALTH AND MOBILITY ALLOWED THEM TO OPERATE BEHIND ENEMY LINES, PROVIDING CRITICAL INFORMATION THAT INFORMED BRITISH STRATEGIC DECISIONS.

NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS:

- IDENTIFYING ARGENTINE TROOP DISPOSITIONS
- DISRUPTING ENEMY COMMUNICATIONS
- SUPPORTING ARTILLERY AND AIR STRIKES WITH ACCURATE TARGETING DATA

SEIZURE OF STANLEY AND URBAN COMBAT

AS BRITISH FORCES ADVANCED TOWARD THE CAPITAL, STANLEY, ROYAL MARINES PARTICIPATED IN URBAN COMBAT OPERATIONS. THEIR TRAINING IN CLOSE-QUARTERS BATTLE WAS TESTED IN THESE INTENSE ENGAGEMENTS, WHICH INVOLVED HOUSE-TO-HOUSE FIGHTING AND SECURING KEY INFRASTRUCTURE.

FEATURES:

- USE OF SPECIALIZED URBAN WARFARE TACTICS
- COORDINATED EFFORTS WITH OTHER BRITISH UNITS AND THE PARACHUTE REGIMENT

CHALLENGES:

- COMBAT IN CONFINED SPACES INCREASED VULNERABILITY
- RISK OF CIVILIAN CASUALTIES AND COLLATERAL DAMAGE

CHALLENGES FACED BY THE ROYAL MARINES
