I had copies of documents and many photos of the family which I included. I then called my sister, making her crazy saying, "Momma had a photograph of so and so, and it looked like this, see if you can find it and mail it to me." She always did. The information in this book was not obtained using Ancestry.com, which is not the most reliable source; rather, the stories and facts were handed down to us by our aunts and uncles over the years and as we recalled some of our experiences growing up. It depicts the life of a family of Italian immigrants, their pursuit of citizenship, the hardships and the challenges they faced.
